Student Organizations were significantly curtailed by the CoViD-19 pandemic in the 2020-2021 academic year. Non-essential on-campus events were cancelled, and many off-campus events were moved to virtual spaces or featured other restrictions.  Despite this, student groups were still able to participate in several programs.	This outcome is open-ended. With financial support from the college, Jefferson State students have opportunities to participate in professional development and leadership events throughout the year.  In the pandemic, college-sponsored Zoom events allowed students to continue to interact. We also began a quarterly roundtable where administration would meet with student leaders and share ideas.

The Men's and Women's Golf programs continue to be competitive, playing in eight tournaments in the Alabama Community College Conference and hosting the National Junior College Athletic Association tournament at Oxmoor Valley, and also placing in the top ten at the NJCAA Championship.
