Part 1: Review of Past 3 Years

1. Service Unit Outcomes Assessment

A. Summarize assessment results.

The Learning Success Center collaborates with the JSCC Library (LRC) in connecting students with resources. Resources include Edmentum Courseware A Learning Success Center resource consisting of 400 plus subjects; PrepStep, Peterson's Test and Career Prep both JSCC Library resources, and JSCC Tutoring Options.

There is a Learning Success Center (LSC) at the Jefferson and Shelby Campuses. The Jefferson Campus LSC was implemented in 1988 and the Shelby Campus LSC in 2008. The LSC at the Jefferson Campus includes two computer labs and a theater room. The LSC at the Shelby Campus includes two computer labs. One lab at each location is open to students and community members. One lab and theater room at the Jefferson Campus and one lab on the Shelby Campus are scheduled by academic classes, workforce development, enrollment services, and other organizations, to conduct simulated labs, testing instructional support, training, and presentations.

The Learning Success Centers at the Jefferson and Shelby campuses are staffed 8am to 8pm Monday through Thursday and 8am to 4:30pm on Fridays.

Utilization for the Learning Success Centers on the two campuses is identified in Table 1:

2. Analysis (as it relates to progress in achieving unit goals)

- A. Each student that visits the LSC is enrolled in an Academic Success Course in Edmentum Courseware and enrolled in Prep-Step and Peterson's Test and Career Prep offered through the LRC. The number of students enrolled in Edmentum, Prep Step, and Peterson's Test and Career Prep is documented.
- B. JSCC Covid-19 response closed the LSC at both campuses March 19, 2020, through February 8, 2021. LSC employees during this time worked remotely, monitoring chat on the LSC website and answering student requests, 8am to 8pm Mon-Thu; 8am to 4:30pm on Friday. The LSC at both campuses were reopened to students and community starting the Summer 2021 term.
- C. Continued to coordinate with nursing advisors to make students aware of the availability of ACT prep courses in Plato and Prep Step to help prepare nursing students for the residual ACT. Worked with advisors and Jeff Coaches at the Jefferson and Shelby campuses about available resources and student assistance offered by the LSC and LRC.

3. Primary Functions/Primary Purpose/Unit Mission

- A. No changes in the unit's primary services occurred since the beginning of the review cycle.
- B. No changes in the unit's primary services occurred in the past three years.

4. Goal Progress

A. The unit's mission was to promote access to computer technology, online resources and instructional programs for college students and community residents. Goals were identified

that supported this mission. The labs were used by many students and community residents. Utilization exceeded the projections, therefore the unit met its goals.

B. Adequate resources were provided to support achievement of goals. Resources were available to support staffing, equipment, software fees and supplies.

Part 2: Implications of Program Review for Developing 3 Year Plan

1. Vision and Direction of Unit

- A. The LSC model used on the Jefferson Campus and Shelby Campus has proven effective in promoting access to computer technology, online resources and instructional programs.
- B. Plans for 2022-2023 include collaborating with Dual Enrollment to ensure dual enrolment students are aware of LSC and LRC resources and setting up students with LSC and LRC resources based upon the courses they are taking during a specific semester. Develop email campaigns in collaboration with the LRC to promote JSCC academic resources and tutoring services.
- C. Students at the St. Clair and Chilton campuses have access to LSC resources and assistance via the LSC website and through monitored chat. This method of LSC presence at these campuses will continue.
- D. The LSC will continue to collaborate and develop relationships with other units.
- E. The LSC has effective lines of communication including a link on the College's website that promotes access to available resources. Communication with students include email, chat, electronic forms, and phone contact.

Part 3: Evidence of Staff Participation in Program Review

- 1. The unit director communicates with staff regularly to discuss operations of the unit and identify any challenges. These discussions allow staff to discuss key components of this review. Discussions with faculty and administrators resulted in the sharing of resources between units and inclusion of the program's needs in the College's technology plan.
- 2. This unit does not have an advisory committee, but relationships are in place with units that have a shared mission.
