Name of Unit: Veterinary Technology

Mission Statement (for the unit): The mission of the Jefferson State Community College Veterinary Technology Program is to train Veterinary Technicians in a two- year educational program with the skills and concepts consistent with the American Veterinary Medical Association- Committee on Veterinary Technician Education and Activities (AVMA-CVTEA) guidelines. The program develops the student’s knowledge of the fundamental principles and skills underlying veterinary technology. This is a distance education program developed to provide students with a more accessible education in their preferred field of study. Upon satisfactory completion of the program, students may be eligible to take the National and State Board Exams to become licensed Veterinary Technicians.
